Daniel Ho was born the sixth of seven children in Hong Kong on October 31, 1957. In 1964, he along with his five sisters, one brother, grandmother, mother, and father were sponsored by some loving Christians and immigrated to New York City.

Dan grew up in New York City, attended Brooklyn Technical High School, The Cooper Union, and eventually Nyack College and Alliance Theological Seminary.

In 1979 he married Barbara Joles. In 1980 they, along with their infant son Ryan, moved to Chinatown, NY and started an English-speaking congregation in the New York Chinese Alliance church. In 1982 their son Andrew was born, and the family of four moved to Queens, NY where they planted and grew Queens Chinese Alliance Church.

In 2007 Dan and Barb moved to Houston. They worked with home group ministries and became agents for the Houston Food Bank distributing food to local people in need. In 2012 Dan was called to serve as senior pastor of Chinese Baptist Church and retired from that calling in October 2020.
